This Addendum is hereby made a part of the Request for Proposals and Project Documents to the same extent as if it was originally included therein and is intended to modify and/or interpret the bidding documents by additions, deletions, clarifications or corrections. The Contractor shall acknowledge receipt of this Addendum in their Proposal on the "Receipt of Addenda" form (herein attached) and shall include the form in Volume III, "Contractual."

PROPOSER QUESTIONS/REQUSTS FOR CLARIFICATION

- 1. Q: Who are we making our case to? Municipalities, state taxing bodies, voters?
 - A: The intent is to make the case for expanded regional transit to the community as a whole. But with a focus on elected officials and the business community. Additional engagement and education may occur later but are not in scope for this project.

KCATA anticipates leveraging the final plan documents in multiple ways over the coming years.

- 2. Q: Scope is general and leaves room for creativity. Can be a \$200K effort or a \$4M effort. What about public outreach? Will you share a budget?
 - A: KCATA's budget range is \$250,000 to \$350,000.

Extensive public outreach has occurred around the Smart Moves Plan and the RideKC Next program. The intent is not to duplicate these completed public outreach efforts.

- 3. Q: Can you provide additional information on the two portions of sales tax from KCMO? The Sunset tax through April 2024 and Smart Moves Plan connected to the KC Chamber.
 - A: KCATA receives revenue from two sales taxes collected citywide in the City of Kansas City, Missouri:
 - A ½-cent retail sales tax authorized by the General Assembly with no sunset, passed through the City's "Public Mass Transportation Fund".
 - A voter-approved 3/8-cent retail sales tax authorized by voters in 2003 and reauthorized in 2008 that expires in April 2024, passed through the City's "KCATA Sales Tax Fund".
 - An additional 1/8-cent authorization is available for a voter-approved tax but would need support from the City to put in front of voters.
 - All sales tax revenue is provided in accordance with the annual operating contract approved by the City Council.

Smart Moves is the region's transit vision developed by MARC, KCATA, and our regional transit partners. Detailed information about Smart Moves 3.0 is available at http://www.kcsmartmoves.org/

- 4. Q: For the Project Website, can the consultant host the website, or will KCATA want to host the site? If KCATA will host the project website, what platforms does the hosting environment support, and can third-party tools/applications be integrated within the KCATA website?
 - A: The Project Website should be hosted by the consultant. The website should have a unique URL that will be transferred to KCATA after the completion of the project. Consultant will be responsible for the creation of website content, with approval by KCATA staff. Content and assets will be transferred to KCATA at the end of the project. KCATA currently uses Expression Engine as its content management system, and content should be able to be transferred to CMS upon termination of the project. A referring or summary page is expected to be placed on RideKC.org and KCATA.org, giving the basics of the project and directing interested parties to the project website for more details.

Content should be optimized for mobile devices and special care should be taken to make the website accessible for people with disabilities.

- 5. Q: Many DBE's from outside the region are unlikely to already have a Missouri Certification/ Can DBE's certified in other states apply for Missouri Certification after award?
 - A: Yes, but DBE credit will <u>not</u> count toward work done by that firm until the certification is complete. KCATA is a certifying agency, so you may contact Mr. Whitney Morgan, KCATA's DBE Liaison Officer, at <u>wmorgan@lcata.org</u> or (816) 346-0277 for more information. If you are considering a potential DBE firm to add to your team, you will need to start this process now.
- 6. Q: Is there a GTFS (or similar format) representation of the SmartMoves network, which could be used to analyze its benefits? Does it provide a complete transit network or just the infrastructure corridors?
 - A: There is not a GTFS for the entire SmartMoves 3.0 plan, but most routes including all of the Fast & Frequent lines are represented in current service.

- 7. Q: In scope item 2.2, third bullet, you refer to "both people benefits and monetary benefits". Can you clarify what you mean by monetary benefit, and how you expect that to be measured?
 - A: Transit provides numerous benefits to the users of the system as well as to the overall regional community, including those that do not use transit on a regular basis. The specific metrics to best describe and measure the benefits of an expanded regional transit system are to be identified and described as part of this effort. Kansas City's regional economy is not growing as fast as our peer cities. It is assumed that the lack of region-wide public transportation coverage and frequency represented by a lack of job access via transit is contributing to this slow growth. Most requests for service are from new job centers that are focused on the lower end of the wage spectrum and in areas with limited current transit services.
